UKS2 News (Years 5 and 6)

In Year 6 we have been finishing our book, 'The boy in the striped pyjamas' and will be watching the film this week. In English we have been writing persuasively about the horrors of war. We have been completing our science topic about light, discussing the length and shapes of shadows.

In Year 5 we have been learning about famous figures from the Black civil rights movement: Rosa Parks and Ruby Bridges, as well as creating an art mask in the style of Lois Mailou Jones. We have also been learning about the Amazonian explorer Percy Fawcett and writing a biography about him and the 'Lost City of Z'.

In science we have been investigating changes to materials, using milk and vinegar to make casein plastic and looking at whether changes are reversible or irreversible, while in computing we have been creating games using Scratch.

It might also be good to mention the Chance to Shine cricket coaching which has been taking place throughout this half term thanks to Surrey County Cricket Club and their youth coaches who have been great at getting the kids excited to learn about and play cricket.


