LKS2 News

Both years 3 and 4 have made a fantastic start to their new history topics this term. Year 3 are learning about the Romans and year 4 children are studying a topic called 'Ancient Civilisations' which includes learning about Ancient Sumer, Ancient Egypt and the Indus Valley. Year 4 have made a great start with writing their own ancient Sumer temple hymns with expanded noun phrases and prepositional phrases. In year 3, the children have started their research on different Roman Emperors in order to write a biography about them. They have been thinking about using expanded noun phrases to describe the Emperors and what their lives were like.

During this term, year 4 will be learning about ancient city life, inventions and social hierarchy. In Maths we are focusing on different properties of polygons including their angles and symmetry. The children are making great progress each week with their times tables and are looking forward to showing off their quick recall skills in the times table test in May. Keep practising your times tables of j2blast!

In year 3 this term, the children will be learning about life in Ancient Rome, the Roman Army and religion in Rome. We will be writing biographies, letters, myths and poems! In Maths we will be learning how to add and subtract fractions, use money and how to tell the time. The children are already working so hard and trying their very best!

UKS2 News (Years 5 and 6) We have had a fast start to the term in Year 5 and the children have come back ready for action. Well done! We have begun our new topic - Groundbreaking Greeks - and we are beginning to write our own myths in the style of Theseus and the Minotaur. We have also started reading our new topic text called 'Who let the Gods out?' by Maz Evans, which is a really fun book. We will be using this text throughout the term as the basis for our reading comprehension lessons. Our new topic in Science - Forces - has begun and we will be carrying out some practical investigations over the coming weeks. We are planning a trip to the British Museum to enhance our learning about Ancient Greece this term so do look out for a letter which will be coming home soon Year 6 have had a busy start back to the school year ensuring the children are as ready and as prepared as possible for their upcoming SATs. We have also begun our new topic 'Britain at War' where the children are learning about what war is, its causes and the wars that Great Britain have been involved in. In English we will be writing balanced arguments about war. In Maths, it is all about revision! While in guided reading we have started the book 'The Boy in The Striped PJS'. Look out for lots of letters and forms that have already been sent home and will continue to be sent home - make sure they are returned to school ASAP.	Foundation Stage Welcome to the new children in Nursery who have just started with us. They have settled very well into their new school and are love playing in their classroom. The children in Nursery are enjoying their new topic this half term called 'Sunshine & Sunflowers.' They are reading the book called 'The Little Gardener by Emily Hughes.' In Literacy, they are enjoying sharing and talking about the story. In Phonics, they are enjoying the song bag games. In Maths, the children are practising their number recognition. Outside in the playground, the children have been hunting for signs of Summer. The children in Reception have been learning about their new topic which is called 'Creep, Crawl and Wriggle'. They are reading non-fiction texts which provides them with lots of facts about minibeasts. The children have loved reading 'Superworm' by Julia Donaldson and 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar' by Eric Carle. In Literacy, the children are reading captions and facts about minibeasts. They are then matching the caption to the correct picture. The children have loved looking at different mini beasts using magnifying glasses and writing about their favourite minibeasts and identifying the similarities and differences between them. In Phonics this week, the children are on Phase 4 sounds. The children are using their phonics knowledge and are sounding out

KS1 News (Years 1 & 2) Last week, Year 1 were busy with their Design and Technology companion mini project 'Chop, Slice and Mash'. As part of the project the children learnt about sources of food and linked this to their previous understanding of carnivores, herbivores and omnivores. They learnt about food hygiene and then got to explore the preparatory skills of peeling, tearing, slicing, chopping, mashing and grating. They began by making either a fruit or a vegetable salad of their choice, exploring the textures and tastes of the different ingredients. They then used their knowledge and the techniques to design and make a supermarket sandwich according to a specific design criteria before evaluating it. The children thoroughly enjoyed the experience but most felt the best part was getting to eat the food they had prepared. Miss Thirtle	very busy, they have been looking at number bonds to 10, matching numerals to quantity, counting and recognising numbers to 10 and beyond and looking at smaller parts of a number. The children have enjoyed threading making patterns and creating webs. Outside in the playground, the children have loved observing the mining bees and talking about what the bees are doing.
