

This project teaches children about the physical and human characteristics of the United Kingdom, including a detailed exploration of the characteristics and features of the capital city, London.

English: Writing

- Writing short narratives
- Descriptive writing
- Introduce nouns, verbs and adjectives
- Grammar and punctuation including capital letters, finger spaces and full stops.
- Applying phase 2-5 phonic skills

Science

Children will be looking at;

Seasonal changes

- Signs of winter and spring
- Changes in the weather
- Using observational skills

<u>Materials</u>

- Distinguish between an object and the material which it is made from.
- Identify and name a variety of everyday materials.
- Compare and classify materials by their properties.

English: Reading

Reading sessions are done 3 x a week and broken down into 3 parts

- Day1 decoding (sounding out)
- Day 2- prosody (using expression)
- Day 3- comprehension (understanding)

We will also be reading some wonderful stories together in class related to bright lights, city lights.

e.g. A walk in London, Topsy and Tipsy visit London, Paddington at the Palace, Pussy cat, Pussy cat where have you been?

Maths

- Count, read and write to 80.
- More/less
- Count in 2 and 10s.
- Number bonds to 20, though addition and subtraction.
- Equals as a balance
- Multiplications; using arrays
- Dates, days, weeks, months and years.
- Sequencing vocabulary e.g. after, next,

Bright Lights, Big City

This project teaches children what landmarks are and that there are different types. They will also identify countries and capital cities of the UK.

Children will use; maps and aerial images, location and directional language

Computing

Pupils learn to: ● select brushes and colours ● use the undo function ● use multiple layers in their art ● paint on top of photographs

We are Publishers (Create a multimedia eBook about our achievements)
