These rules help us to stay safe on the internet:

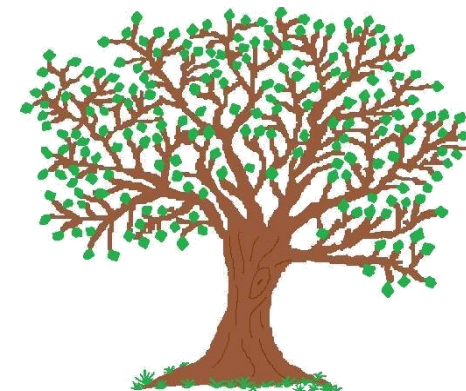
We only use the internet when an adult is with us.

- To attend parent/teacher meetings and to work together with the school and other professionals;
- To make school aware of issues that might affect children at school;
- To make sure children come to school everyday, on time (unless they are ill) and tell us why they are not in as soon as possible;
- To make sure that children come to school looking smart in their school uniform;
- To make sure that children bring their reading book and school bag every day and their PE kit on the right day;
- To help children to complete and return their homework on the right day;
- To collect their children promptly at the end of their school day.
- To ensure that children's use of the internet is monitored closely to ensure their online safety.
