

UKS2 News (Years 5 and 6)

In the last couple of weeks, Year 5 have been learning about fractions, decimals and percentages. We have also been studying the life cycles of plants and have been doing some planting ourselves, taking cuttings of rosemary to explore the science of plant reproduction and regrowth.
