Foundation Stage News

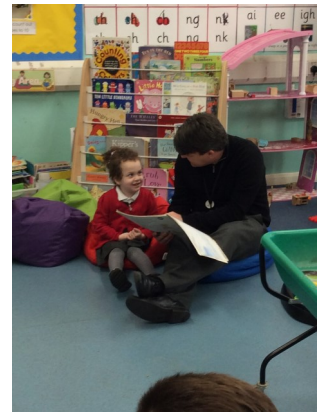
Foundation Stage have had another busy week this week. In Nursery, they have been talking about being a good friend. They thought about all the different ways they can be nice and made a display in in their classroom.
