

LKS2 News

Both years 3 and 4 have gotten off to a fantastic start with their new topics.

In Year 3, we have started our brand new topic 'Rocks, Relics and Rumbles'. We are learning properties about of sedimentary, igneous and metamorphic rocks and how they are formed. We are also to be writing non-chronological information report about the earth's crust. In art we have been looking at creating motif drawings of fossils and objects with detail.



Year 4 children have started learning about rivers in

'Misty new topic Mountain, Winding River'. So far we have learnt about different features of a river and how the journey of the river starts in the upper course and runs through the middle course to the lower course. In English lessons we have been improving our grammar skills of expanded phrases, fronted noun adverbials, pronouns conjunctions so that we are ready to write amazing diary



entries about our river walk. In Art the children are developing their sketching skills by looking at mountainous landscapes through a viewfinder and drawing what they could see.

Foundation Stage

Welcome back to Nursery and Reception and a big welcome to the new children who have started Nursery this term. The children in Early Years come back to school very happy and have settled well. They have enjoyed sharing stories about what they have been up to over their two weeks holiday.

Nursery have started a new topic this term called 'Starry Night.' The children have enjoyed their sharing the book called 'Whatever Next?' written by Jill Murphy. The children have been engaged at the D.T. table where they have been making rockets to allow them to fly to the moon, using a range of junk modelling materials. Jake in Nursery had made a lovely model. When he was asked what he had made, he replied "it's an explosion of happiness!"

In Maths this week, the children have been recognising numbers on rockets and counting out certain amounts. The children have enjoyed recognising their names. Please continue to practise this at home

In Reception, our topic this term is 'Long ago'. We have been discussing what babies need and why and how their own needs have changed as they grow up. We made our own baby catalogues by choosing baby items and describing why a baby needs them. This week we have been reading the book 'Rosie's Hat' by Julia Donaldson. We used the words 'then', 'next' and after that' to describe what happened in the story. In Phonics, we have learnt the sounds ai, ee, igh, oa , /oo/ in 'zoom', /oo/ in book, /ar/ and /or/. We have also learnt the tricky works 'was', 'you' and 'they'. In Maths, we are learning about the composition of numbers and that we can make them in different ways. e.g. 0+5, 1+4, 2+3 all make 5. Please continue practising recognising all the sounds we have learnt so far and continue developing the understanding of composition of numbers. Your children are all taking home two books this week. The 'Pleasure for Reading book' is a book which the adult can read to the child and enjoy together. The Phonics book is for your child to sound out and read to an adult. Please read everyday as this will help children to recognise their sounds and practise blending sounds together to make words. We hope you enjoy reading over the weekend.
