

# Catch-Up Premium Strategy

The government has provided £1 billion of funding to support children and young people to catch up after the disruption to schools during the Summer 2020 COVID-19 'lockdown'. This includes a one-off universal £650 million catch-up premium for the 2020 to 2021 academic year to ensure schools have the support they need to help all pupils make up for lost teaching time.

As of 18.11.20, we have allocated the funding in the following ways:

Teaching Assistant to provide group support in KS2	£21,850
Additional LSA time to provide 1:1 and group support in Year 2	£5,595
Additional Teacher time to provide 1:1 and group support in Year 1	£3,755
<b>Total</b>	<b>£31,200.00</b>

The children are assessed on an on-going basis with summative assessments made at the end of each term. In addition, we use PIXL tests in reading, grammar, punctuation and spelling and mathematics to inform teacher judgements. These tests provide a 'standardised score' and 'question level analysis' allowing us to track progress and identify gaps.
